Croft Head Cottage

The cottage at one time provided accommodation for farm workers at Croft Head Farm. The buildings were constructed between 1800-1850 and formed part of a Georgian Coaching Inn. In the 19th century it became a farm and was eventually turned into a private residence. Downstairs is an original 'Wrelton Range', which was made in the village.

The village of Wrelton is mentioned in the Domesday Book and once boasted five inns (Croft Head being one of these – spot the mounting block outside the front door and the deep drinking trough designed for large horses at the top of the courtyard). There is now only one pub, The Buck Inn, which serves bar meals and Sunday lunches.

The Cottage

Background **Central Heating** is controlled from within Croft Head Farm. The heating is scheduled to come on twice daily, in the morning and evening. We will happily change this to suit your needs, please just let us know.

Woodburning stove The stove should be first lit with paper and sticks. Once the fire has taken hold, add 1 or 2 logs as required. Additional fuel for the wood-burning stove can be obtained at the Spar within the Shell Garage in Middleton, matches are stored on the top shelf of the cupboard in the kitchen. Please keep matches away from children.

Downstairs

The **Cooker** is electric. Before using the grill please open the grill door.

Hot water works off a combi boiler and is automatic.

Fire extinguisher is located on the wall to the right of the kitchen sink and a fire blanket is on the wall to the right of the front door.

There is a **washing machine** and a clothes drying rack is provided on the 1st floor landing.

When using the **Microwave** please use appropriate dishes.

Cutlery can be found in the cream cupboard in the left hand drawer and table mats are in the table drawer.

The **Television** provides Freeview channels. The **DVD** also plays CDs.

A small collection of books is available in the cream cupboard. Please feel free to take a book home if you have not finished it, if you do it would be great if you could leave a book you have enjoyed in its place. There is a second hand book shop in Pickering, opposite the train station which specialises in paperback books, ideal for a holiday read.

First Floor Landing

An ironing board can be found next to the wardrobe, along with a vacuum cleaner and clothes airer. An iron is within the wardrobe. Please note that coat hanging pegs can also be found on this landing.

A **fire extinguisher** is located at the top of the staircase.

Bathroom

Please ensure that the showerhead is returned to the wall bracket after each use.

Top Floor

A fire extinguisher is located at the top of the staircase.

Fire Escape: please do not block the fire escape.

A **Night/Emergency Light** is located on the top floor, this will act as a night light and will light up in the event of a power cut. This is provided for your safety, please do not remove from the cottage.

Outside

Rubbish collection day is every other Wednesday, recycling is collected on the alternate week. We will empty the bin as required.

Recycling

Recycling crates can be found at the top of the courtyard;

Green: Tins/plastic bottles only

Black: Glass bottles only

Blue Bag: newspaper/cardboard (no food contamination)

Plants, during the summer we will discreetly water the plants and containers.

Young (and young at heart!) visitors are welcome to use the 'rustic' table tennis table (found in the barn with the arch), but do so at their own liability. Upper floors and all other outbuildings are strictly out of bounds as they are in varying states of repair.

Car Parking

Please be considerate to our neighbours and don't park in front of their houses. You are more than welcome to park along the road immediately adjacent to Croft Head Farm.

Departure Day

Please leave the cottage by 10am on your day of departure so that it can be returned to the same state you found it in for the next guests to enjoy.

Smoking

Please note for the safety and comfort of all our guests this property is **non-smoking**.

Local Information

Wrelton

The Buck Inn serves food Tue-Sat 5 – 8:30pm, and lunches 12-2 on Saturday and Sunday.

Free range eggs are available from a house just after the pub.

Fish and Chips are available from a mobile fish and chip van which parks at the bottom of the village (just off the sharp corner) on Fridays between 5:50 and 6:05.

In Case of Fire

Evacuate through the nearest exit. There are two points of emergency exit;

- The front door
- In the top bedroom: a fire door will provide an escape route through the main house. Use the small hammer to break ceramic cylinder, pull door, push open the second door and make your way down 2 flights of stairs.

The following fire equipment is available;

Kitchen – Fire blanket and extinguisher

Middle floor – extinguisher

Top Floor – extinguisher

Emergency lighting – emergency lighting is provided which will light in the event of power loss. These are provided for your own safety, please leave powered and do not remove.

If you attempt to deal with a fire, please do not put yourself or anyone else in danger. Evacuating the property is the safest thing to do. Then alert us immediately using a phone outside the property.

Fire Safety

For your own safety please familiarise yourself and other guests with escape routes and location of fire equipment.

Ensure it is easy to escape the building and that the door has not been locked with a key which has been removed.

Any electrical equipment should be low power equipment and safe to use (electrical heaters etc should not be used).

Devices left on charge should not be left unattended and should be placed on a non-flammable surface.

Please switch off and unplug any electrical products when not in use (iron, hair straighteners etc).

Please do not leave pots and pans un-attended when on the cooker.
